Some Contextual Information for Judges:

The Excellence in the Humanities Award was developed specifically to showcase the research-based scholarship of students in the Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences at Shawnee State University.

The prize is awarded to students who are currently enrolled at Shawnee State University and also a participant in the Celebration of Scholarship Conference. The award is for outstanding research and writing projects in the arts, humanities, and social sciences that investigative, project-based, and scholarly. The recipient of this award will receive a scholarship of \$500 applied to their student account.

Students applying for the Award must meet the following criteria:

- To be considered, students must be nominated by a faculty mentor.
- Recipients must be currently enrolled students and participate as oral presenters for the Celebration of Scholarship.
- Nominees must give a 15-minute presentation during a special “Humanities Award” session during the Celebration of Scholarship.
